



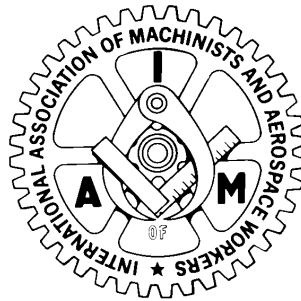

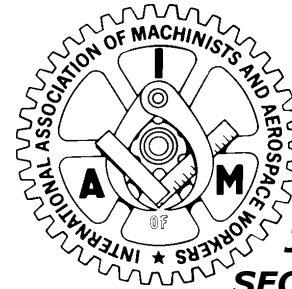

Machinists Apply for Single Employer Status with Air Canada Rouge and Sky Regional

The International Association of Machinist and Aerospace Workers – IAM – has made two separate applications to the Canada Industrial Relations Board, for single employer status between Air Canada and Air Canada rouge (ACrouge) and between Air Canada and Sky Regional Airlines.

Sky Regional is a company that was created to carry out Air Canada flying on Air Canada routes using Air Canada aircraft and non-union labour. ACrouge is a wholly owned subsidiary of Air Canada that was created by Air Canada to carry out Air Canada flying at lower labour costs.

"Under Air Canada's control and direction aircraft and routes are being transferred to ACrouge and Sky Regional Airlines. We have filed these applications to allow us to protect the work done by our members and their jobs at Air Canada' explained IAM District Lodge 140 President and Directing General Chairperson Fred Hospes.

The IAM is the largest union at Air Canada representing more than 8,800 workers in over 40 job classifications including line maintenance mechanics, auto mechanics, baggage handlers, cargo agents, aircraft cleaners, cabin groomers, millwrights, electricians and technical writers.

Members of IAM Local Lodge 103 have ratified a new collective agreement with Flowserve Canada Corporation.

- Increased eye glass benefits

The 28 members include Machinists, Product Assemblers, Welders, Painters and Logistics personnel.

Flowserve is one of the world's leading manufacturers and aftermarket provider of flow control products such as pumps, valves, seals, actuation and instrumentation, steam traps and systems, hydraulic decoking systems, energy recovery systems as well as monitoring and controls.

Their products are used in power generation, chemical processing, water resources, oil & gas and general industries.

Hassan Yussuff elected President of Canadian Labour Congress

The 3.3 million-member Canadian Labour Congress elected a new president for the first time in 15 years at its convention in Montreal on May 8, 2014.

Hassan Yussuff has made history as the first person to defeat a sitting president of the Canadian Labour Congress (CLC). Yussuff is also the first person of colour to hold the office of leader of the CLC.

The new President campaigned on a platform to reinvigorate the labour movement in Canada, pledging to reach out to workers of colour and to lead a more inclusive CLC that pushes back against the anti-labour and austerity agendas of Conservative governments across Canada.

A third presidential nominee, Hassan Hussein, dropped out of the race earlier in the week in order to back Yussuff's bid for presidency.

Chants of solidarity were heard throughout the convention hall in Montreal as Yussuff's supporters rushed to embrace the new president.

Yussuff began his involvement in the labour movement while working as a truck mechanic and member of the Canadian Auto Workers, later becoming the CAW's first Director of Human Rights. In 1999, he was the first person of colour to be elected to the CLC executive. Three years later, he was elected secretary-treasurer of the CLC, a position he held until being elected president.

The Hudak Million Jobs Myth

Hudak's million job creation project is based on the Conference Board of Canada 2013 report for PC - The Impact of Tax Measures on Ontario's Economy. This is a simulation of a 1 percent corporate income tax (CIT) cut. The report looked at the decade economic benefits of a 1 percent (CIT) cut in 2013.

There would be 2,071 jobs created in the first year and gradually over the 10 years accumulated a total of 42,788 jobs. Assuming Canadian corporations are generous enough not to add the CIT cut bonus to their half trillion dead money accounts.

The PC spin doctors took the decade total 42,788 and divide it by 10(years) to include the multiplier effect for a higher jobs creation number, then multiple by their proposed 3.5% (corporate tax cut) to get the PC job creation base number for 3.5% CIT cut which is 14,976 jobs. Then they assumed equal jobs would be created each year for 8 years by multiplying a factor of 8 which equals 119,808 jobs. Though PC already said this CIT cut will be phased in over time.

PC spin doctors also grossly inflated job creation from other areas such as 5,048 from electricity reduction, 199 from western Canada free trade, 10,600 from regulatory reduction etc., all multiple by a factor of 8 again, which equals 126,766 jobs.

This would give Hudak a over-inflated 246,584 jobs created over 8 years. Not 1 million jobs.

And don't forget the PC 100,000 public sector job lost promise.
